

# **Access-A-Home Program Policy**

### I. POLICY OVERVIEW AND OBJECTIVES

This policy provides an overview of eligibility and funding for the Access-A-Home Program (Program) of the Department of Municipal Affairs and Housing (Department).

This Program is to provide grants of up to \$7,000 to help renovate homes to make them wheelchair accessible. Often the grant pays for a wheelchair ramp, but it can also be used to pay for widening doorways and hallways or making bathrooms wheelchair accessible. The annual income limit for eligibility is \$60,000.

## II. DEFINITIONS

Applicant A person who applies to the Program, including the

individual's spouse or common-law partner

Architectural Barrier A physical restriction limiting the access to, and use of

a wheelchair at an individual's Principal Residence

Housing Unit Residential premises occupied as the Principal

Residence of the Applicant or their Immediate

Relative who is a wheelchair user by reason of a long-

term disability

Household A person or group of persons who occupy or have

need of a unit in Nova Scotia and who do not have a

Principal Residence elsewhere in Canada

Immediate Relative A person related to the Applicant by blood, marriage,

common-law partnership, or adoption

Principal Residence Primary place of habitation

Total Gross Income Total household income before taxes. *Note:* Some

forms of income may be excluded from this

calculation.

## III. APPLICATION

Individuals or their Immediate Relatives who are wheelchair users or expected to become wheelchair users by reason of a long-term disability, with a Total Gross Income of less than or equal to \$60,000.

## IV. POLICY DIRECTIVES

## **Program Eligibility**

- The Applicant or their Immediate Relative must be a wheelchair user or expected to become a wheelchair user within six months of the date of application by reason of a long-term disability. Medical documentation is required in the case where individual is expected to become a wheelchair user.
- 2. Total Gross Income of the Applicant is less than or equal to \$60,000.

## **Eligible Properties**

- 1. Any existing residential Housing Unit is eligible provided that:
  - a. It is occupied as the Principal Residence of the Applicant, and
  - b. There are Architectural Barriers that restrict the use of a wheelchair.
- 2. If the Applicant is not the owner of the residence, written approval from the owner is required.

## **Eligible Alterations**

Eligible alterations must be:

- 1. Related to a housing,
- 2. Permanently installed, and
- 3. Improve access and/or safety for the wheelchair user in the Housing Unit.

# **Ineligible Alterations**

- 1. Any repairs carried out prior to the Department providing approval in writing for the assistance are not eligible.
- 2. Any repairs, alterations or adaptations that are not related to use of a wheelchair are not eligible.
- 3. Supportive care related items, special equipment for therapeutic purposes, portable appliances and aids are not eligible for funding under this Program.

## **Eligible Costs**

- 1. Costs eligible for assistance are limited to:
  - Materials and necessary equipment rental;
  - Contractor labour and related costs; b.
  - Harmonized sales tax. C.
- The cost of labour performed by any member of the Household is not an 2. eligible cost.
- 3. Immediate Relatives of the Applicant may include a charge for their own labour only where they are normally employed in the renovation or construction industry and are not a member of the Household. Such costs must not exceed trade prices for the area, as determined by the Department.

## Grants not to exceed amount

- 1. Assistance will be in the form of a grant up to a maximum of \$7,000, subject to fund availability.
- 2. The contribution can only be used for eligible repairs as deemed by the Department.

## **Application and Approval**

- 1. Applicants will submit an application to the Department. Approvals are subject to eligibility requirements and Program funding availability.
- 2. Work will not commence until the Applicant has received approval in writing from the Department.

## Inspections

The Department reserves the right to conduct site inspections to determine that eligible work has been completed for the purpose of issuing payment.

#### ٧. ACCOUNTABILITY AND MONITORING

The Director of Housing Services will monitor the policy's implementation, performance and effectiveness. The policy will be reviewed for revisions as needed.
